Cpl. Mitchell is a fairly tall, slim person who looks much younger than her age. She is neat in appearance, aggressive by nature and is alert and interested in other people and their problems. In conversation she is very definite and has no difficulty expressing her ideas clearly and concisely, although at times she has trouble seeing both sides of a question.

Following enlistment until proceeding overseas, this N.C.O. was retained on recruiting duties and did a good deal of travelling in this respect as well as office work of an administrative nature. She went overseas in an early draft and was in the first group of C.W.A.C. to reach the continent being employed as a clerk in 2nd Echelon. She was most satisfactorily placed and the problems which the girls had to meet apparently did not bother her nor keep her from carrying out her duties well.

Cpl. Mitchell is still somewhat undecided about what she intends to do as she is expecting immediately upon discharge to go to U.S.A. and it is quite possible she may remain there and work with a relative. However, should she return to this country, she intends to apply for Credits in order to begin her own business as an angora-rabbit farmer. She has done a great deal of studying on this subject, has corresponded with people already in this business and feels that she could make a success of it with very little capital outlay, as there is a ready market for the wool and the reward is excellent. In view of her plans and the study already put in, it is quite possible that such a venture could be handled very successfully by a woman who is mature and sensible and has good business sense.
